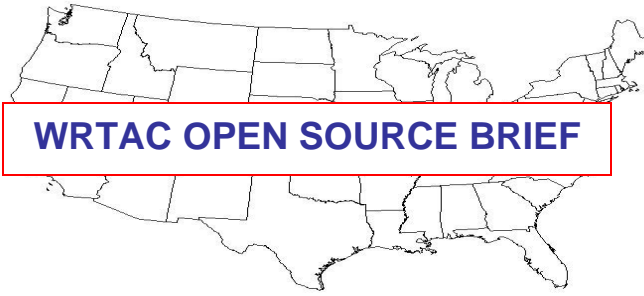

Stabbed Man Dies; Police Seek Information

On Tuesday, March 9, 2010, at approximately 1:08 a.m., officers from the Seventh District were called to the unit block of Forrester Street, SW, to investigate the report of a stabbing. Upon arrival, officers located an adult male inside of an apartment at that location suffering from apparent multiple stab wounds. The victim has been identified as **33-year-old Michael Bailey**.

ER at Children’s Hospital Reopens after Fire

The emergency room at Children’s National Medical Center in Washington D.C. has re-opened after a fire broke out in a utility area. For most of Saturday, officials working in the emergency room could not treat trauma patients. Patients had to be rerouted to other hospitals as fire officials cleared water and smoke out of that part of the facility. A D.C. fire department spokesman says the fire was reported about 9 a.m. Saturday. It was contained, though, because the sprinkler system was activated. No injuries were reported. The cause of the fire is still under investigation.

Convention Center Area Road Closures

Road Closures: Closures will be coordinated by the Metropolitan Police Department. The closures will begin at approximately 10 pm on Sunday, April 11, and continue through approximately 8 pm on Tuesday, April 13. All of the following areas will be posted with *Emergency No Parking* signage. Fencing and other physical barriers will also be in place as will uniformed law enforcement officers. Vehicular traffic will be limited to vehicles with a law enforcement/public safety function.

Pedestrian traffic inside the restricted areas will be limited to residents and owners/employees of local businesses that fall within the secure area. Government issued photo identification, such as a driver's license, non-driver photo ID or passport will be required to gain access.

- New York Avenue NW, eastbound and westbound from 6th Street, NW to 7th Street, NW and 9th Street, NW to 11th Street, NW.
- K Street, NW, eastbound and westbound from 6th Street, NW to 7th Street, NW and 9th Street, NW to 10th Street, NW - Traffic will be allowed to run eastbound and westbound on K Street, NW between 7th Street, NW and 9th Street, NW but will then be diverted southbound on one of those two Streets.
- Massachusetts Avenue NW, eastbound and westbound from 9th Street, NW to 11th Street, NW.
- L Street, NW, eastbound and westbound from 6th Street, NW to 10th Street, NW.
- M Street, NW, eastbound and westbound from 6th Street, NW to 10th Street, NW.
- N Street, NW, eastbound and westbound from 6th Street, NW to 10th Street, NW.
- 7th Street, NW, northbound and southbound from O Street, NW to Massachusetts Avenue NW.
- 8th Street, NW, northbound and southbound from O Street, NW to N Street, NW.
- 9th Street, NW, northbound and southbound from O Street, NW to New York Avenue NW.
- 10th Street, NW, southbound from L Street, NW to New York Avenue NW.
- There will be intermittent closures of other intersections in the vicinity of the Convention Center that will temporarily affect vehicular and pedestrian movement.

Illegal Skimming Device Discovered at Rockville ATM

If you've used the ATM at Congressional Plaza in Montgomery County recently, keep an eye on your account. Rockville Police found a skimming device at Wachovia Bank's automated teller machine on the 1600 block of Rockville Pike in Rockville Saturday night. These devices are attached to ATMs to capture bank customers' card numbers, often working in tandem with a small hidden camera that records the user's PIN. An alert citizen had reported seeing some sort of skimming device, said police. Police have removed the device and are investigating. The bank has been notified. Police said if you used the ATM, check for strange activity on your account and report it to the bank as soon as possible. For more information on how ATM skimmers work, see

Health Information Security Conference in D.C.

The National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) is co-hosting a conference to explore the current health information technology security landscape and the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) Security Rule. The conference on “Safeguarding Health Information: Building Assurance through HIPAA Security,” presented in collaboration with the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Office for Civil Rights, will be held on May 11 and 12, 2010, in Washington, D.C. This conference will provide a forum to discuss the present state of health information security, and practical strategies, tips and techniques for implementing the security requirements of HIPAA. Industry panels will discuss breach notification rules and the state of compliance with the Security Rule. The meeting is expecting to draw hundreds of HIPAA security rule implementers; security, privacy and compliance officers; assessment teams and audit staff.

Barbecue Potato Chips Recalled Due to Possible Salmonella Contamination (Public Health)

Lance, Inc. with headquarters in Charlotte, North Carolina is recalling 28,087 cases of Tom’s Barbecue Potato Chips packaged in 1 oz (UPC 021900060406), 2.25 oz (UPC 021900011477) and 8.5 oz (UPC 021900062417) sizes because it has the potential to be contaminated with Salmonella. The product was distributed in 34 states. The product is sold in retail stores and was distributed by direct store delivery by Lance route trucks and by Lance distributors. The product comes in 1 oz, 2.25 oz and 8.5 oz flexible packages. Code dates on the recalled product carry the following expiration dates: May 14 2010, May 21 2010, May 28 2010, Jun 4 2010, Jun 11, 2010, Jun 18 2010, Jun 25 2010, Jul 2 2010, Jul 9 2010, and Jul 16 2010.

Minnesota Firm Recalls Ham Products for Possible Listeria Contamination (Public Health)

Lorentz Meats, a Cannon Falls, Minnesota establishment, is recalling approximately 100 pounds of ham products that may be contaminated with Listeria monocytogenes, the U.S. Department of Agriculture’s Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) announced April 4. Various sizes of whole or half ham packages of “KOWALSKI’S Markets, FULLY COOKED, SMOKED HAM, Naturally Smoked with Hardwoods, KEEP REFRIGERATED.” Each package bears a freeze by date “FREEZE BY 05/14/10” as well as the establishment number “Est. 21207” inside the USDA mark of inspection. The ham products were produced on March 12, 2010, and were distributed to retail establishments in Minneapolis/St. Paul, Minnesota, and the surrounding area. The problem was discovered through third-party testing, and the establishment notified FSIS. FSIS has received no reports of illnesses associated with consumption of this product.
